# Waste Management – what we have in Salford

- Weekly food and green collections
- Fortnightly Co Mingle Recycling collections
- Fortnightly Pulpable collections
- Three weekly residual collections
- Issue free Recycling bins
- Provide 560 Litres of waste capacity every three weeks
- Greatest bin capacity in GM
- Recycling at 47.2%
- 5 x Waste Awareness Officers (plus additional 3 out to advert)
- 3 x Household waste recycling centres (HWRC) in Salford & 1 x on our Little Hulton border, in Bolton & 1 x Reuse Shop(Boysnope)
- 27 recycling waste streams at the HWRC's
- Third sector re use partners
- Bin Audits for residents to aid recycling and managing waste capacity
- Trade Waste service provided to circa 1,300 businesses (of circa 10,000 businesses)
- 561 Street Champions
- Over 300 Salford community litter group clean ups



# Key Objectives and Ambitions of the Strategy

## **Two overarching Objectives:-**

- To maximize the value of resource use-(making sure all waste produced has an “end life” i.e. Re-used or Recycled); and
- To minimise waste and its impact on the environment.

## **The Strategy aims to contribute to the delivery of five strategic ambitions:-**

- To work towards all plastic packaging...being recyclable, reusable or compostable by 2025;
- To work towards eliminating food waste to landfill by 2030;
- To eliminate avoidable “single use” plastic waste, over the lifetime of the 25 Year Environment Plan;
- To double resource productivity by 2050; and
- To eliminate avoidable waste of all kinds by 2050.

# Potential Impacts from the strategy

- **Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR)**
  - ✓ Packaging 'producers' paying for impacts of their packaging
  - ✓ Potential cost impact on the consumer.
- **Deposit Return Schemes**
  - ✓ Should increase quantity and quality of material collected
  - ✓ Removal of material from kerbside

# Potential Impacts from the strategy

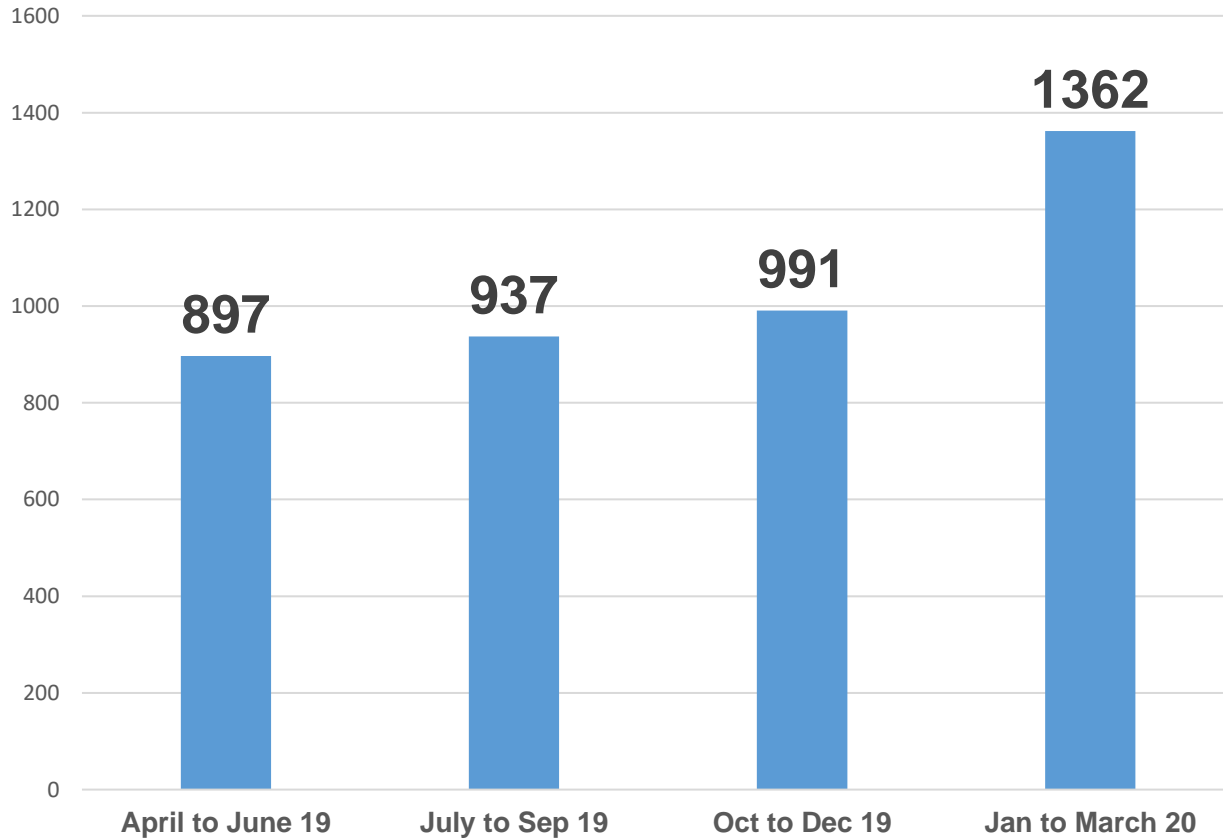
- **Consistency of collections**

- ✓ Same bin colours
- ✓ Frequencies
- ✓ Separate collection of fibres, glass, metals, plastics
- ✓ Free garden waste
- ✓ Weekly food
- ✓ Cartons, PTTs (Pots, Tubs and Trays), plastic films
- ✓ Residual waste capacity
- ✓ Trade waste zoning – (Reducing the number of collection companies within city centre – better control of bin clutter)

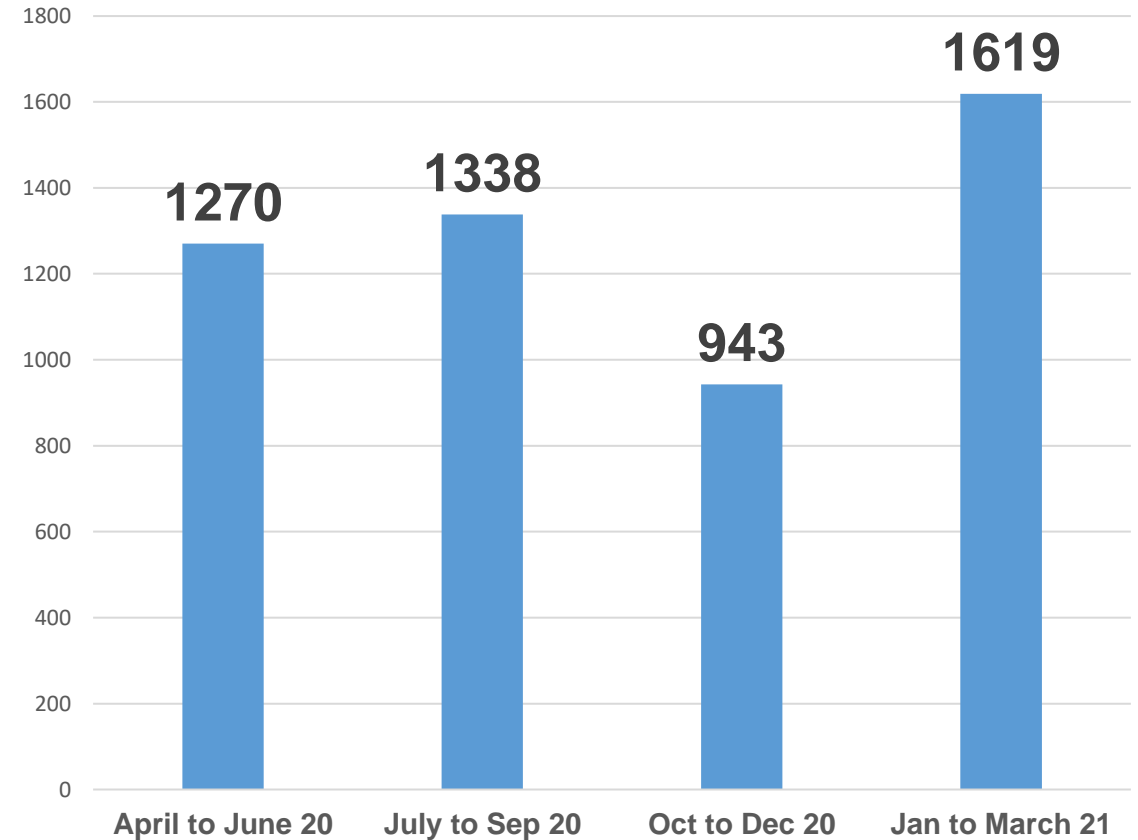
# Fly Tipping in Salford

# Street Champions / Litter Heroes

- 561 Street Champions and over 300 clean ups over a 12 month period
- Numbers involved estimated at over 1,000 members of the public undertaking local environment clean ups on all open land in our City
- Litter pickers, gloves and bags provided for all clean ups
- Over 2,500 bags full of litter removed
- Estimate that over 100 tonnages of waste collected
