### 1. Executive Summary

<b>Why is this report being brought to the Board? - Relevance of this report to the priorities of the Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy, the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment or integrated working</b>	This final draft of the Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (PNA) is brought for approval by the Board following consultation and ahead of publication.
<b>Health and Wellbeing Board's duties or responsibilities in this area</b>	The PNA is a statutory responsibility of Health & Wellbeing Boards, to examine pharmaceutical service provision in the area and identify current and future needs. Statutory duty to publish an updated PNA every three years, latest PNA publication required by 1 October 2022
<b>Key questions for the Health and Wellbeing Board to address - what action is needed from the Board and its members?</b>	To approve the final PNA for publication now that statutory consultation process has concluded.
<b>What requirement is there for internal or external communication around this issue?</b>	The draft PNA was produced in collaboration with key stakeholders and informed by surveys of the public and pharmacy providers. A statutory 60-day consultation on the draft PNA ended on 4 September (see Section 1.5 of PNA document). The finalised 2022 PNA will be published on the Salford City Council website by 1 October 2022.

### 2. Introduction

The Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (PNA) is a statutory assessment of pharmaceutical needs within an area, required to be undertaken by local Health and Wellbeing Boards on a three-yearly cycle. The PNA examines current provision of pharmaceutical services in the area, identifies gaps in provision or future needs within the next three years. A statutory 60-day consultation with relevant organisations ended on 4<sup>th</sup> September.

The PNA concludes that pharmaceutical services provision is sufficient across Salford now and in the near future, with the exception of a need for a pharmacy to provide necessary services in the Lower Kersal area, and the potential to improve access by establishing a pharmacy close to Salford Quays, depending on future development in the area.

### **3. Recommendations for action**

The Health and Wellbeing Board is asked to approve the Salford Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment 2022 for publication.

The publication of a PNA by 1 October 2022 is a statutory requirement. The PNA also forms part of the Salford Joint Strategic Strengths and Needs Assessment (JSSNA) and evaluates the level of pharmaceutical provision across the city in the context of current and future need.
