<p>Will disclosure help people to understand and participate in public debate about current issues?</p> <p>No, this is part of a commercial settlement with a contactor</p>	
<p>Will disclosure help people to understand why the Council has taken certain decisions?</p> <p>No, this is part of a commercial settlement with a contactor</p>	
<p>Will disclosure give the public information about the personal probity (or otherwise) of elected members or council staff?</p> <p>No, this is part of a commercial settlement with a contactor</p>	
<p>Will disclosure encourage greater competition and better value for money for council taxpayers?</p> <p>No, this is part of a commercial settlement with a contactor</p>	
<p>Will disclosure allow individuals and companies to understand decisions made by the Council that have affected their lives?</p> <p>No, this is part of a commercial settlement with a contactor</p>	
<p>Is the information about factors that affect public health and public safety? (NB you should be careful if considering the release of information which might adversely affect public health and safety)</p> <p>No – the reports provide no specific information in this regard.</p>
